ABOUT THE PRESENTATION

This day-long workshop provides participants with the opportunity to acquire and apply clinical skills pertaining to the assessment and treatment of suicidality in children and adolescents. Dr. Owens will discuss current suicide statistics and some current research and prevention efforts. The bulk of the workshop will focus on identifying suicide risk factors and warning signs and how to use that data to make sound clinical decisions. Participants will have the opportunity to consider real-world cases and to apply the information gleaned from the didactic portion of the workshop to making clinical decisions about those cases.

At the conclusion of the presentation, attendees will be able to:

- 1) Discuss current suicide statistics;
- 2) Identify current research and describe relevant prevention efforts;
- 3) Locate suicide prevention and postvention resources online;
- 4) Identify risk factors for and warning signs of suicide;
- 5) Make evidence-based clinical decisions based on assessment data.

Shane G. Owens, Ph.D., ABPP is a board-certified psychologist who works with college students, emerging adults, and their families. He is an authority on college mental health policy and practice, specifically behavioral risk management.
