Every good ABA program needs accurate data collection to monitor behaviors and guide treatment decisions. The behavior analyst needs to judiciously decide on the behaviors to modify when time and staffing are limited and to be able to choose data methods to meet the needs of functioning in a community or vocational setting. Attention should be given in training staff that may have less skill and experience in ABA methods.

Adults with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) exhibit language and social-communication deficits of varying degrees. Many require an augmentative/alternative communication system (AAC) to either replace or enhance their existing expressive language skills. Younger as well as older adults with ASD are capable of learning novel language and increasing communication skills. This webinar will focus on functional language and communication and provide an overview of evidence-based teaching strategies to increase language acquisition and social-communication skills in adults with ASD
